FY 2006 Activity Report / Self-Evaluation October 2005 – September 2006

BACKGROUND

The Community Advisory Board (CAB) for Nevada Test Site Programs is one of seven Environmental Management (EM) Site-Specific Advisory Boards (SSABs) chartered throughout the U.S. Department of Energy complex to provide informed feedback on Environmental Management activities. An excerpt from the national charter established for the SSABs, describes the objective, scope of activity and duties of the SSAB, as follows:

In accordance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act, the EM SSAB will provide the Assistant Secretary for Environmental Management (EM), the appropriate DOE Field Managers or Assistant Managers for Environmental Management activities, and any other U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) official the Assistant Secretary shall designate, with information, advice, and recommendations concerning issues affecting the EM program at various sites. Specifically, the Board will provide advice and recommendations concerning the following EM site-specific issues: clean-up standards and environmental restoration; waste management and disposition; stabilization and disposition of non-stockpile nuclear materials; excess facilities; future land use and long-term stewardship; risk assessment and management; and clean-up science and technology activities. The Board may also be asked to provide advice and recommendations on any other EM project or issue.

INTRODUCTION

The mission of the CAB is to provide recommendations and advice to the U.S. Department of Energy Nevada Site Office (DOE/NSO) Assistant Manager for Environmental Management relative to Environmental Management (EM) programs, which includes environmental restoration and waste management activities at the Nevada Test Site (NTS). This requires the review of related plans and programs, reviewing and prioritizing EM projects and forwarding comments and recommendations from the CAB to DOE/NSO for review and action, as appropriate.

This activity report / self-evaluation includes a recap of the NTS CAB's activities and letters to the DOE/EM program. .

The CAB's work scope includes full Board meetings, as-needed working committee meetings, and participation in national SSAB meetings and workshops. Board members may also attend training sessions provided throughout the year to improve their knowledge and understanding of the projects upon which they were working, which are also included in this document.

In addition to attending full Board meetings and committee meetings, CAB volunteer members and liaison members contribute countless hours to studying and addressing a myriad of complex issues. These activities provide a foundation on which the CAB bases its recommendations to the NTS EM program.

The bulk of the CAB's work is initiated and completed within committees, which are led by a chairperson and vice chairperson. CAB members bring a diverse community perspective to their efforts and are required to serve on at least one working committee. Each committee is empowered to conduct research, evaluate documents, analyze issues, interview EM project managers and produce written recommendations on issues for discussion and/or approval by the CAB as a whole. Work products include formal recommendations; analysis of technical, legal and socioeconomic issues; and information for the public. Recommendations are initially developed within the working committees and then presented to the full Board for discussion / approval. Approved recommendations are formally transmitted to the Assistant Manager for Environmental Management for consideration and action.
